What is a DMP?

A DMP is a Data Management Plan. Almost all funding organisations require researchers to write a DMP when they receive funding.

Why are DMPs important?

A DMP requires a researcher to actively think about research data management (RDM). RDM planning is the first step in making research data findable, accessible, interoperable, and reusable (FAIR).
